7-51 Rigging, House Moving, Wrecking and Dismantling

Classification Description

Includes rigging, hoisting, and general demolishing work of buildings, houses, bridges and other structures. Allows a contractor to raise, level, and move buildings and houses when the job exceeds \$7,500. Also allows the contractor to sign contracts for the pickup and removal of rubbish, debris and garbage from construction activities or from storms.

Introduction



Rigging, House Moving, Wrecking, and Dismantling is a *closed book* examination with 50 multiple-choice questions and a minimum passing score of 70. You will have **two hours** to complete this examination.
